Welcome to the <u>eighth edition</u> of Newark and Sherwood District Council's Business E-Newsletter.



Exciting events have taken place across the district over Spring, from Easter celebrations at Sherwood Forest to the recent Platinum Jubilee. Over the four-day Jubilee bank holiday, 18,792 visitors were identified by Newark's footfall sensors, with Friday 3 June being the busiest day – it saw an increase in Newark's footfall by almost 40% compared to 2021.

The Nottinghamshire County Show and the Lincolnshire Business Expo made successful comebacks, showcasing our region's incredible businesses and talent.Meanwhile, the first Brompton Bikes Station in Newark was installed by Castle House, enabling people to hire bicycles for a greener commute across town. The station represents another step towards success for one of our eight <u>Towns Fund Projects</u>, with more stations to follow.

Finally, our first Logistics Workshop (pictured above) took place on 14 June. Delegates from logistics businesses and organisations gathered at Newark College to discuss, with local education providers, the outputs of the Sisclog (Smart Innovation, Supply Chain and Logistics Enterprise Zone). This project aims to link businesses with training, R&D and new technologies to establish a 'logistics hub', boosting the sector and providing exciting new career pathways. Newark Business Awards



Friday 10 June saw the return of the Newark Business Awards for a night of celebrations at Newark Showground. A huge congratulations to all those nominated. You've all gone above and beyond in the service of our community!

NSDC once again sponsored the 'Best Start-up' category, recognising the fantastic efforts of new enterprises in the district.

. Oliver Reilly Estates, an independent estate agents that offer a one-to-one service located in the heart of Newark Town Centre, were awarded Highly Commended. After being furloughed in 2020, Oliver took the risk of opening his own agency, launching in March 2021 with a slogan that defines his business well – 'Passionate about Property'. He singlehandedly arranges all aspects of the business, and has sold 65 properties in Newark alone during his first 12 months, with further sales in Mansfield, Doncaster and Blyth.

The winner of Best Start-up was Honies Farm Barns. Opening to the public in August 2021, Honies Farm Barns is run by Michael and Kirsty Hardstaff and consists of four luxury holiday barn conversions in East Stoke. They have excelled, attracting visitors from across the country and describing the business as a "new venture in an industry so alien to what we are used to."

Michael and Kirsty worked hard for the past five years to convert the accommodation, breathing new life into redundant farm buildings to provide modern comfort to guests while maintaining the character of the original site. They work closely with local businesses to provide the best possible experience for their guests, using local tradespeople for maintenance, offering locally sourced chocolates and keenly promoting the local area.



Good news stories from the Business Resilience and Growth Programme



Newark and Sherwood District Council's £300,000 Business Growth and Resilience Programme has offered support and guidance from industry specialists to local businesses in four key sectors.

The scheme provided tailored workshops, mentoring, business model reviews, and more, aimed to help businesses develop plans, identify new markets, modify working methods and establish supply chains. Businesses that completed the programme also received the opportunity to apply for a discretionary grant, which could be used to boost recovery and growth.

Emma, Soapology

I was lucky enough to participate in the Business Resilience and Growth Programme with NSDC and Business Doctors. I applied because although I was experiencing growth in my business, Soapology, I knew how valuable it would be to have expert advice and support. I was getting big orders and had made the decision to move into larger premises, but I needed to ensure that that I could fulfil the orders of all my clients, old and new.

Participating in the programme gave me 2 hours a fortnight to work on my business rather than in it. The knowledge I have gained has been tremendously useful and I had so many 'lightbulb moments' throughout the 15 weeks. My notebook is now packed with information and ideas that I can now begin to implement in my business to facilitate growth.



Tapping into the knowledge of different guest speakers was wonderful, enabling me to get answers to questions, and helping me build connections in web design and digital marketing which have continued after the programme. It was so beneficial to connect with local business owners in manufacturing, to share ideas and advice and to learn from other's experiences.

I was also able to identify areas that I need to focus on and things that I can delegate to others, which has safeguarded two jobs within my business. The grant funding has helped enormously in purchasing much-needed equipment and items, ensuring that we can now work more productively and efficiently.

I would recommend participating in this programme to any business owner. I now have clear goals and plans in place to achieve them, I also know who my ideal customer is, how to find them, and how to get them to buy.

Finally, I learned that my product is not just a soap bar – it is luxury handcrafted artisan soap that helps people to reduce plastic consumption, providing a more eco-friendly, palm oil-free, product with the added benefit of it being gentle on your skin.

Matt, Jackson Design Associates

As an employee of Jackson Designs, I applied to the programme to further develop my business management, leadership and communication skills. I found it to be a fantastic opportunity, helping me to connect with likeminded individuals and businesses who faced the same day-to-day hurdles as me, who gladly shared their knowledge and thoughts.



The course was well structured with a unique expert each week, covering topics such as 'colours' personality profiling. This was such an interesting element and it enabled me to spot characteristics in people, which I now use to adapt the way I communicate with clients and colleagues.

The course has enabled our business to invest in areas that had been neglected, and has given me the drive to continually develop my skills to help achieve business success in the future. Further to this, the

grant we received has allowed us to appoint a specialist web designer to create a brand new website. The past couple of years navigating our way through the pandemic have been tough, and as a result we were unable to commit spending on this. Now, the new website will help the business attract new clients and staff as we continue to grow going into the future.
